Acts 11:20-24

- 20. But there were some of them, Cypriot and Cyrenian men, who came to Antioch and began speaking to the Hellenists, proclaiming the good news about the Lord Jesus.
- 21. The Lord's hand was with them, and a large number who believed turned to the Lord.
- 22. Then the report about them reached the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent out Barnabas to travel as far as Antioch.

The Witness of Encouragement

People need encouragement.

Cynical View of Life – People are repeatedly disappointed and disillusioned with what this world has given them

Positive people point them to better dreams.

The Witness of Encouragement

 Self-Centeredness – With so many selfcentered people around folks feel locked out and isolated.

Encouragers reach out and include them in.

 Fear – People fear rejection.
Encouragers help people see past their fears.

We are Encouraged When...

- 1. Our strengths are confirmed
- 2. Our direction is affirmed
- 3. Our hard times (sufferings & failures) are put into perspective
- 4. Our efforts are appreciated
- 5. Our higher motives are inspired

1. We Encourage When We Confirm the Strengths of Others

"For I want very much to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you, that is, to be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine."

(Romans 1:11-12)

2. We Encourage When We Affirm The Direction of Others

2. We Encourage When We Affirm The Direction of Others

 "Finally then, brothers, we ask and encourage you in the Lord Jesus, that as you have received from us how you must walk and please God—as you are doing do so even more." (1 Thessalonians 4:1)

3. We Encourage When We Help Others Put Hard Times into Perspective

 Paul and Barnabas returned to some churches they had started, "Strengthening the hearts of the disciples by encouraging them to continue in the faith, and by telling them, 'It is necessary to pass through many troubles on our way into the kingdom of God." (Acts 14:22) 3. We Encourage When We Help Others Put Hard Times into Perspective

- Heaven will make our sufferings look small.
- "For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far out weighs them all. (2 Corinthians 4:17)
- Failures aren't final.

- "I really appreciated that Word you gave me the other day. It really spoke to my heart!"

5. We Encourage When We Inspire Higher Motives in Others

 "May our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us eternal encouragement and good hope by grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen you in every good work and word."

(2 Thessalonians 2:16-17)
