- There is so much to see all around us!!
- There is so much to see and learn about.
- Do you know "how" we learn?
- We mainly learn by "seeing" and by "hearing".
- Can we learn about GOD that way?

- Remember, we cannot see God.
- We do not hear him talk to us unless we "learn" to listen to Him.
- How can we know Him?
- We can know Him through the things He has made.

- Did you ever look at the stars, shining bright in the sky?
- Do you often look around at the earth, so big and wide?
- There are so many wonderful things on the earth – furry animals, birds, flowers, and little bugs.
- There are big wide oceans of water, with thousands of big fish and little fish.

Who made all this?

Who takes care of all this?

"Somebody" must have made it all.

That "somebody" is God.

- Sometimes we hear the thunder roar, and we see the lightning flash.
- You and I cannot make thunder and lightning.
- We cannot make clouds and rain.
- We cannot make the wind blow, and we cannot "stop" the wind when it blows.
- All these things we cannot do tell us that there is a great God.

He makes the thunder and lightning.

 He makes the wind and the rain, and even the snowflakes.

- Sometimes we hear a bird sing.
- We cannot give a bird a sweet song to sing.
- We cannot teach them how to make their nest.

 When we see a bird fly and hear them sing, we know there is a great God who made birds.

Flowers are exquisitely beautiful.

They have lovely petals.

 There are many kinds of flowers – blue, yellow, green, purple, pink, orange, etc.

There are multiple varieties.

 Some have a drop of honey-water deep down in their throats.

Some have sweet perfume in their petals.

 Look at a flower very carefully and see how beautiful it is.

 And think of the living seeds that flowers make.

 We cannot make even "one" real flower, with a drop of honey-water in its throat and sweet perfume in its petals. Only God can.

So the flowers tell us there is a God.

 We "know" there is a God because we can see what He has done.

We see the things He has made.

Stop next time you are "busy".

We say, "stop and smell the roses".

Take some time and see God in His wonderful creation.

 See the works of His Hands and the works of His Spoken Word.

God spoke and all this was created.

And we are the works of His hands.

For He formed us in our mother's womb.

The most beautiful of all His creation!!

- In Proverbs 30:18-19 it says, "There are three things that are too amazing for me, four that I do not understand: the way of an eagle in the sky, the way of a snake on a rock, the way of a ship on the high seas, and the way of a man with a maiden".
- The writer has spent time meditating on God's creation.
- And these things have amazed him and also he acknowledges that he cannot understand them with his finite thinking.

- Have you taken time to be amazed?
- Then the writer goes on in verses 24-28, "Four things on earth are small, yet they are extremely wise: Ants are creatures of little strength, yet they store up their food in the summer; coneys (rock badger) are creatures of little power, yet they make their home in the crags; locusts have no king, yet they advance together in ranks; a lizard can be caught with the hand, yet it is found in kings' palaces."
- Have you taken time to see God's wisdom in His creation?

- Now, we will look at what the writer says in verses 29-31, "There are three things that are stately in their stride, four that move with stately bearing: a lion, mighty among beasts, who retreats before nothing; a strutting rooster, a he-goat, and a king with his army around him."
- Again, there is so much to ponder and think about.

- These verses were written by a man who spent time mediating on God's creation.
- Finally, I want to encourage you to listen and heed the words of Solomon, a man filled with God's wisdom, "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth, before the days of trouble come and the years approach when you will say, "I find no pleasure in them"—(Ecclessiastes 12:1)

For God has said, "Yet I will remember the covenant I made with you in the days of your youth, and I will establish an everlasting covenant with you."
 (Ezekiel 16:60)

- God, when we look around us, we see that You are a very great God.
- When we look up at the sky, the heavens tell us that You are great.
- When we look around us, the birds and flowers tell us how wonderful You are.

Lord, we are so small!

But we belong to You.
